

PREPOSITION CALENDAR

Try these activities if your child is mixing up prepositions (e.g., in/on/under/behind/beside/in front)

| sing a song that has prepositions in it | go shopping and talk about where the food is | phone a friend/relative and tell them where they put their favorite toy | go to a restaurant and let your child tell everybody where to sit | while dressing your child, talk about where the clothes are | play a game with your child incorporating prepositions (Simon Says) | watch a TV show with your child and talk about where the characters are |
| play dress up with your child (in mommy's closet), find the clothes and talk about where they are | go for a walk and point out where items are | at lunch time, talk about where the food is on the plate | go to a library and borrow a book that has prepositions in it | mail a letter to your child with pictures hidden on it | at bath time hide the water toys and find them with your child | let your child help put the dishes away telling them where to put each item |
| look through a magazine with child and cut out pictures that have objects in different places | go swimming and talk about where the children are | pick a toy to play with your child and have them tell you where to put it | make up a song with your child that has prepositions in it | in the backyard, talk about where toys/flowers are | look through a family photo album and talk about where the people are | rent a movie with your child that has prepositions in the title |
| let your child help make dinner and tell them where to put the food | look at a book and let your child tell you where the objects/characters are | let your child help find their clothes, telling them where to find each one | let your child help set the table, telling where to put each item | take a drive in the car and point out where the objects are | let your child help put the groceries away, telling them where to put the food items | at dinner time, talk about where the food is on the plate |
| go to a dollar store, have your child tell you where their favorite toy is | pick 1-2 toys to play with your child and hide them in different spots then talk about where they are | let your child help make snack emphasizing prepositions | colour a picture with your child with lots of objects in different locations | let your child tell family members where to sit at the dinner table | at breakfast, talk about where the food is on the plate | read a story that has prepositions in it |
